

Monthly Recipe



Since Cinco de Mayo is coming up, here is a recipe for an easy dip to serve.

Beef Enchilada Dip

Ingredients

- 2 teaspoon oil
- 2 garlic cloves , minced
- 1 onion , finely chopped
- 1 lb ground beef
- 2 tablespoons <u>taco seasoning</u>
- 14 16 oz can refried beans
- 10 oz can Enchilada sauce of
- 14 oz black beans , drained
- 2 cups grated Montery Jack or Cheddar Cheese
- Cilantro , for garnish

Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F.
- 2. Heat oil over high heat in a skillet. Add garlic and onion, cook for 3 minutes until translucent.
- 3. Add beef and cook, breaking it up as you go, until it changes from pink to light brown.
- 4. Add taco seasoning and cook until beef is browned.
- 5. Add refried beans and Enchilada sauce. Cook for 5 minutes or until thickens to your desired consistency. Stir through black beans.
- 6. Transfer to a heatproof bowl.
- 7. Top with cheese then bake for 15 minutes or until bubbly and golden.
- 8. Serve warm with corn chips, garnished with cilantro if desired

Illinois Region Board Meeting Minutes

March 30, 2019

Host: Fox Valley Chapter Mt. Prospect Library

President Chris Schurrer called meeting to order at 10:31 am.

Roll Call: Present: Chris Schurrer, Dan Sobczyk, Darlene Sobczyk, Bob Wenderski, Lee Nelson, Bob Market, Andy Voss, Bob Markert was proxy for John Otto, Steve Kolish, Nancy Nelson, Jerry Bodden, Jim Sikora, and Joan Bodden was proxy for Joanna Vroman. Excused: Al Matison, Dale Woosley. Guests: Gary and Debbie Smithe; Laura Cielenski.

Secretary's Report: Nancy Nelson made a motion to accept the minutes as written. Bob Markert seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Wenderski reported an opening balance of \$23,386.00 as of February 9, 2019. Income totaled \$303.00. Expenses totaled \$1,364.30. Closing balance as of March 30, 2019 of \$22,324.70. For the year so far, we are in the red of \$230.88. Bob Markert motioned to accept the report. Lee Nelson seconded. Motion passed.

Standing Committee Reports:

Membership - Andy Voss reported currently we have 149 memberships with a total of 262 members. Andy summarized the cost to produce one roster: \$3.06 of which \$1.45 is for mailing. He purposed to email the rosters to all who have email with hardcopies only to board members and those without email. After a discussion, members who want only the email copy not be sent a hardcopy and that most members prefer hardcopy; we will continue to mail out the roster. Chris stated National is offering a first time member of AACA free one year membership and reminded us, the region does the same. Chris pointed out at one time we had a pamphlet describing our club and the chapters - did we want to produce one again? Following a discussion, we would look into new pamphlets - depending on cost.

Publication - Laura Cielenski who is the current newsletter editor for the local Thunderbird car club (CTCC) and her Condo Association provided a presentation of her current work. She will be doing the Sidelights on monthly basis starting May 1, 2019 for us. The secretaries of each chapter with the exception of Waukegan/North Shore (they have a sidelights reporter) and the region secretary will forward Laura details of events (both past and future) for the region and chapters. She would like the information no later than the 20^{th} of the month. Laura will be setting up an email address specific to the club. More details to follow.

Legislation Lee Nelson reported nothing much was happening. There are some rumblings of fees being increased, but nothing concrete. All antique plates will be expiring at the end of the year. Website - Dan Sobczyk reported he was up to date. He also reported he will be doing the March newsletter by weeks end.

Archivist: 1) Chris Schurrer handed out a summary of the items he has accomplished since out February meeting. He is not up to date yet, but is getting there. And he still has a list of things he is working on. 2) Regarding the Antique Automotive Magazines, they will be given to National either at Hersey or Auburn. Bob Market and Bob Wenderski volunteered to deliver them for Chris to Auburn.






Each year Packards of Chicagoland hosts an evening out at a popular restaurant in the northern suburbs of Chicago.
