were wrapping up with the Cantigny show, and now we are in full focus on the Fall Tour, with so much that has happened in between.



Apple Crisp - Perfect and Easy

Prep time: 10 minutes Cook time: 40 minutes Ready in 1 hr.



Ingredients

2 1/2 cups apples - peeled, cored, and sliced

1 cup sifted all-purpose flour

1 cup white sugar

1/2 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/4 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup butter, softened

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 375°
- 2. Lightly grease an 8-inch square baking dish.
- 3. Arrange apple slices evenly in prepared baking dish. Sift flour, sugar, cinnamon, and salt in a bowl. Cut in butter using a pastry blender or 2 knives until mixture resembles coarse cornmeal; sprinkle over apples.
- 4. Bake in preheated oven until topping is golden, 40 to 45 minutes.

Cool slightly before serving.

A brief shower in the morning and an overcast sky helped keep this year's Vintage Transportation Extravaganza at the Illinois Railway Museum in Union, IL small.

The morning started with two tours converging at Union. The first, the northern route, beginning in Wauconda, followed the route that was planned in 1998 but was not used. The southern route followed a back roads route from Sandwich. Both arrived about the same time, with the ability of getting some prime shade parking in the back of Electric Park.

The show was bustling with cars of many different varieties. Mopars? Got em; FoMoCos? Got em; General Motors? Got em! Not just domestics but imports, too ,with a nice selection of Volkswagens, Saabs, unique Japanese market Toyotas, and a Yugo - just because.

Occasionally a breeze would come through which kept the area pleasant, but many hopped onto the trains to help get that breeze throughout the show - street cars on the circle track, and four different selections on the main line including the Frisco 1630 steam engine, and the Burlington Zephyr (popular for its air conditioning!).


