## Monthly Recipe

### Chicken & Sausage Gumbo

#### **Ingredients**

- 5 Tablespoons butter
- 4 Tablespoons flour
- 1 cup chopped sweet onion
- 1 cup chopped red bell pepper
- 1 cup chopped yellow bell pepper
- 2 celery stalks chopped
- 1 1/2 cups sliced smoked andouille sausage
- 2 garlic cloves minced
- 1 teaspoon ground mustard
- 1 teaspoon cayenne pepper
- 1 1/2 teaspoons paprika
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder or granulated garlic
- 1 teaspoon creole seasoning or cajun seasoning
- 4 cups chicken stock
- 2 1/2 cups chopped cooked chicken breast
- 1 bay leaf
- 1 cup frozen okra (chopped)
- 1 teaspoon kosher salt
- 1 teaspoon freshly ground black pepper
- 2 cups cooked white rice optional, for serving

#### Instructions

- 1. Melt the butter in a stock pot over medium/high heat.
- 2. Whisk in the flour and continue whisking until the mixture starts to turn golden brown and smell nutty, approximately 3-4 minutes. (Do not stop whisking or the roux will burn.)
- 3. Stir in the onion, bell pepper and celery. Continue cooking for 2-3 minutes, stirring constantly, until the vegetables begin to soften.
- 4. Add the sausage to the pot and stir to combine. Cook for 1 minute longer.
- 5. Stir in the garlic, mustard, cayenne, paprika, garlic powder and creole seasoning. Cook for 1 minute longer, stirring constantly and scraping up any brown bit on the bottom of the pan.
- 6. Slowly add the chicken stock to the pot stirring to combine. Add the chicken and bring the soup to a boil.
- 7. Turn the heat to low. Add the bay leaf, okra, salt and pepper to the soup and stir to combine. Simmer for 10 minutes or until the soup begins to thicken.
- 8. Serve the chicken gumbo over rice, if desired.



## The Classic-Car Bible

Hemmings Motor News motors on in Bennington, Vermont.

o you know what a camshaft does?

When you read "n.o.m.," does your mind automatically translate it as "non-original motor"?

If the answer to either question is yes, then you are probably familiar with the monthly Hemmings Motor News, the car enthusiasts' bible that turns 55 this year.

Today, the complex in Bennington, Vermont, where Hemmings has been based since the 1960s, includes not just the office building where most of the 100 or so employees work, but also an old-fashioned gas station with an attached gift shop, and a classic car workshop and museum. The latter features more than 30 vintage vehicles, including a Bennington fire truck from 1924 and an open-top Buick believed to have been the first motorized postal vehicle in Vermont.

On Thursday nights throughout the summer, the company hosts a series of "cruise-ins" that draw car buffs from near and far, eager to show off their wheels or ogle other people's treasures. Farther from home, the signature gold-lettered *Hemmings* delivery vans are a common sight at car shows across the country.

Surely all this is a far cry from anything founder Ernest Hemmings imagined back in January 1954, when he launched Hemmings Motor News from his home in Quincy, Illinois. The first issue was hand-typed, and its four pages opened with a note: "This is the first issue of a

little monthly magazine that I hope will be of real interest to the person interested in older models."

Apparently it was indeed of interest, since by 1985 the magazine had more than 210,000 subscribers, and annual revenues approached \$10 million. Its covers were brown and utilitarian, and the newsprint pages numbered more than 400, each one packed with a pirate's treasure map of ads.

Since 2002, *Hemmings* has been owned by North Carolina-based American City Business Journals. Now printed in full color, the magazine is the flagship of a bevy of niche auto publications and a website featuring thousands of searchable ads.

The ability of *Hemmings* to reinvent itself should hardly be a surprise. After all, making the old like new again is kind of its thing. —*Joe Bills*

## The Great Adventure — By John O'Halloran - DeKalb IL DesPlaines Valley Chapter reporter

When Illinois Region member Frank Reiss suggests a road trip, it may become a great adventure. So, after his phone call at 7:20 AM on Saturday December 15 asking if I'd like to run chase car, I bit. Frank was following a 1940 Buick on E-bay. It received no bids at the \$7,000 open, so he phoned the seller.

Retired Commonwealth Edison station operator from the Springfield, Illinois generating plant, Ray Carter worked in carpentry after leaving his career in 1994, and vended cars on the side with the Carter Family used car agency in Pawnee, about thirty miles southeast of the state capitol. Ray described the Series 40 1940 Buick Special sedan as "a barn find" that had undergone some renovation in recent years, and swore it was in tip-top condition for a road trip. He had driven it as far as fifty miles in a single trip, though the car hadn't been driven at all in several years.

We arrived in Pawnee later that morning, to find the car tucked in a back garage, the battery hooked to a charger. Frank cranked the straight eight, depressing the gas pedal to engage the starter button. She fired right up. As the engine warmed, Frank noticed a growing pool of antifreeze under the front. It appeared to come out of the radiator overflow. This is usually not a good sign. At the very least in means low coolant, and the engine is overheating. In progression it can mean a stuck thermostat, bad head gasket, cracked head or cracked block. Roy added antifreeze with the engine running, a little more was lost but we did not see bubbles in the radiator neck. Frank pulled the Buick out for a better look-see.

The black paint job was mediocre, done some years ago. The interior had been renovated with new material but was not of judging quality, the bumpers recently plated, the radial tires mounted on the original 16" rims were new but of extremely low-quality Chinese manufacture.

Frank tooled the car around neighborhood streets. It rode nicely though the knee-action shocks offered the usual Buick 'wallow'. The engine sounded great and pulled smoothly. First gear is straight cut but second and third were helical and meshed well. One of the rear brakes was 'grabby'. We recheck the coolant level back at Rays' place and add just a few drops. By now Frank is thinking the puddle is likely caused by a bum head gasket, not a terribly pernicious worry. Frank comes out of Ray's house twenty minutes later, title in hand. We're going to drive it back to Genoa. Except the battery is dead. Ray hooks up the charger, I quiz him for the local Farm & Fleet store (it's in Springfield) and we're off, with me in Franks' Pontiac.

This Buick looks good rolling down the road! I call my sister who lives near Petersburg if we can leave the car for a week or a month or whenever. We stop at the Fleet-Farm store for a new six-volt. They don't have any of the long skinny ones but suggest a Farm & Home store a quarter mile north on Dirksen Parkway. Frank leaves the car running, and soon comes out with a new correct battery. She fires right up; I call my sister that we won't see her before Christmas.

Car runs righteous at interstate speeds, in forty miles Frank pulls off for a restaurant break, then tosses me the keys. Oh boy! A Buick is not like a Hudson, with the knee-action shocks it just floats down the highway like a magical Arabian carpet. I owned an overhead valve straight eight Buick, 1949 model 56-S sedanet when I was a kid, and I got to tell you, Buick made a hell of a fine straight eight. And this from a flathead guy.

In a hundred miles, as darkness approaches, I turn on the headlights. Honestly, there's not much of a glow. After we switch drivers, Frank mentions I hadn't pulled the switch out all the way and was running on parking lights... Frank finds oncoming cars flashing him because his headlights are too bright.

We abandon the car in my driveway, and Frank comes over the next few days to tinker. The rugs were redone with the upholstery; Frank cuts away excess material so the underseat heaters can throw some convection through the cabin. The generator is checked at MARS, the local shop. It's good but the regulator is kerplunkt. Frank switches the unit for an alternator, disassembling it first to install the correct six-volt component. The front step plates are wrong. Frank finds the left and rights sides are flip-flopped. I mention the right headlight bulb is upside-down. Frank makes this right and determines this is why he was being 'flashed'. Frank trouble-shoots the grabby brake to rear shoes that are worn, partially falling away from the locating lugs because they are adjusted out to meet the drums, which have been cut in the past and are reaching the end of their service life. New shoes are ordered. An adjustment is made to the brake linkage, which had been too tight.

### The Great Adventure for a Great Buick

He installs new red lenses on the trunk lid. It's neat to watch them blink when he activates the turn signals. And he's over today, trouble-shooting the non-working brake lights. Frank machines a new shock absorber link for the left rear, replacing one that had snapped. The car wallows less now.

With all the cars on the market in 1940, why would a buyer choose a Buick? In rooting through the paperwork in the owners' manual envelope, we find the car was purchased new by Albert J. Hinrichs of Benson, Illinois. His 1941 driver's license shows he was 5'7" tall, 165 lbs, had blue-gray eyes, and was born October 1, 1896. His occupation is not listed. Curiously there is no owners' manual in the envelope...

The Series 40 Model '41' Special sedan rides on a 121" wheelbase, weighs in at 3660 lbs, has a 248 cubic inch eight that produces 141 brake horsepower at 3600 rpm, 130lbs or torque at 1000 rpm, and runs it through a single disc dry plate clutch to a 3.9 rear end. Buick Division produces 283,404 cars for the 1940 model year, and 67,308 of these are Model '41' Special sedans.

If Hinrichs' shopped his local Nash store he would have found the '20' series Ambassador on a 121" wheelbase at \$985, with a 234" overhead valve six-cylinder engine. For an eight in the Nash line he might step up to a series '80' on a 125" wheelbase, but costing \$1,195, nearly one-hundred dollars more than the Buick. Nearest price-wise in the Hudson line to the Buick would be a Country Club Six on a 118" wheelbase at \$1,018, though a nearly identical Super Six sedan with slightly lower grade of trim would be \$870. The splasher six was only 212 cubic inches, but

the Country Club Six weighed 420 lbs less than the Special, so performance would be comparable. An Eight in the Country Club line would cost \$1,118, almost a head-to-head price against the Series '50' Buick. To find an Eight in the Chrysler line, Albert Hinrichs would overlook Dodge and DeSoto, which only offered Sixes, and upgrade to a 128" wheelbase Traveler at \$1,180.

Although my views towards Hudson are rather tendentious, objectively you could determine that Hinrichs made a cost-effective choice in opting for the Buick Special.

Frank plans to put the '40 Buick to work in the movies. Three of his cars, the '40 Ford for DeLuxe tudor, '47 Ford coupe and a postwar Continen

DeLuxe tudor, '47 Ford coupe and a postwar Continental are in the upcoming HBO Fargo Season 4, being filmed in Chicago right now. (My '48 Hudson is there as well.) So look for this Buick Special on the small screen. She's a beauty!






