

Monthly Recipe

Egg Nog Pie



## Ingredients

- 3.4 ounces instant vanilla pudding mix
- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups eqqnoq
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon freshly ground nutmeg
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream
- 1 prepared pre-baked pie crust (9-inch) or graham cracker crust
- 3.4 ounces instant vanilla pudding mix (make sure instant and not stove top)
- $1\frac{1}{2}$  cups eqqnoq
- $\frac{1}{2}$  teaspoon freshly ground nutmeg
- 1 cup heavy whipping cream

## Instructions

In a medium mixing bowl, whisk together instant pudding mix, eggnog, and nutmeg until the mixture begins to thicken (about 5 minutes).

In a separate bowl (or in a stand mixer), whisk the heavy cream on high speed until stiff peaks form.

Gently fold the whipped cream into the eggnog pudding mixture.

Transfer pie filling into the prepared pie crust. (Regular or graham cracker)

Chill for at least 3 hours to allow the pie to firm up.

Serve with additional whipped cream and a sprinkle of freshly grated nutmeg.



Most are limited editions and therefore are rare and very valuable. Beside the cars, he has a display of John Deere small model farm vehicles and equipment, and a huge collection of toy trucks.





## Hershey, PA Eastern Fall Nationals –

Myself, along with W/NS member Dave Jachimowski, and fellow Buick Club member Bruce Eiseman, departed for Hershey PA early (4AM) on Monday, Oct.3rd. Driving straight thru, 737 miles, we arrived at our hotel around 8PM. Tuesday it rained all day, most parts vendors were closed, tarps covered their wares. We spent the day at the AACA Museum and the new headquarters of the AACA. While there, I inquired about our IL Region \$1,000 building fund donation. Previously I was told that our donation went to support the AACA Library, probably to purchase new shelving. A member of the library staff assured me he'll investigate and advise us of the specific use of our donation.

Wednesday afternoon thru Friday the weather was cool and mostly sunny. We covered most of the vendor spaces Wednesday and Thursday; stopping at the Buick Club of America tent to sample their soon-to-be famous cookies, served on fifties and sixties wheel covers.

Friday was the AACA Eastern National Meet. There were approx.1,200 vehicles on display, from early brass cars to "muscle" cars and beyond; this year thru 1997.

I was one of 300+ judges who met for a nice breakfast buffet at 7AM to receive our judging assignments. I judged engine compartments in Classes 27A & 27B, early to mid-fifties cars.

The Hershey schedule was changed this year; and for the next five years: Car show on Friday and vendors Tuesday thru Friday morning.

On the way home Saturday, we stopped at the Gilmore Auto Museum near Kalamazoo, MI. I'm not sure of the number of cars on display, it's in the hundreds. Several national car clubs (Model A, Cadillac, Franklin, Lincoln, to name a few) have their own building, most built to look like a period showroom.
