Monthly Recipe



Easter Cheese Ball

Ingredients

- 2 pkg., 8 oz. Cream Cheese, softened
- 4 slices cooked Bacon, crumbled
- 1/2 tsp garlic salt
- 1 TB Worcestershire Sauce
- 2 cups Finely Shredded Mild Cheddar Cheese, divided
- 1 bunch of parsley

Instructions

Place cream cheese, bacon, garlic salt, Worcestershire sauce and 1 cup of shredded cheese into a mixing bowl. Blend together. Refrigerate for 30 mins.

Using parchment or wax paper, form cheese mixture into a carrot shape. Cover with the remaining shredded cheese.

Top with a bunch of parsley, slightly pushing it into the cheese ball.

Illinois Region Board Meeting

March 11, 2023

Location: Carpentersville Public Works Building

Host: Fox Valley Chapter

1. **Welcome**—President Dan Sobczyk called the meeting to order at 10:40 am and welcomed all the members of the board and guests. He thanked Humberto and Bibiana for providing the venue for the meeting and asked the Secretary, Pat Markert to take the roll.
2. **Attendance:** Board Members present were: Jerry Bodden, Ed Flynn, Jo Ann Flynn, Bibiana Garcia, Dan Helgren, Pat Markert, Al Matison, Lee Nelson, Nancy Nelson, Rose O'Halloran, Chris Schurrer, Jim Sikora, Dan Sobczyk, Andy Voss, Bill Vroman, and Bob Wenderski. Guests present were: Bob Markert, Joan Bodden, Andy Ibbatta, Ken Muellner who brought his cousin Terry Muellner and his friend Teresa Hall.
3. **Secretary report**— Pat Markert reported that she had received no additions, corrections or deletions to the minutes. Motion to accept was made by Rose O'Halloran and seconded by JoAnn Flynn. Passed.

Pat Markert reported that she had been in contact with Sue Eitner at National about an email that had been received that said that the Region and Chapters had failed to send in their annual Officer reporting form and list of members. Pat told the board that the email had been erroneous. The Region forms had been sent in, as well as the forms for the Fox Valley Chapter. Sue was still looking for the reports from Silver Springs, Des Plaines Valley and Waukegan-North /Shore. Pat said that Silver Springs had sent in a written copy and Sue admitted that she had a pile of unchecked mail on her desk. The other chapter Presidents got an Officer Reporting form from Pat and are in the process of getting these items taken care of. Sue Eitner stressed that the Officer reporting forms had to be sent to National (either in written or email form) by January 31. The actual rosters may be sent later, but the officer form does have a deadline.

4. **Treasurer's Report:** Bob Wenderski presented the treasurer's report telling us that since January 14, 2023, the Region had received dues from the various chapter members. Expenses were for tour supplies, Region newsletter, chapter dues payments and meeting costs. A motion was made by Al Matison to accept the treasurer's report; second by Bill Vroman. Motion passed

Standing Committee:

1. **Membership**— Andy Voss reported that as of March 11, the Region has 145 memberships with 249 members and 24 Lifetime Members. He also told the board that the roster was done for 2023 and that the cost to publish hard copies was \$4.45 each. Andy passed out hard copies to the Board Members.

Bibiana Garcia mentioned that she had been contacted by a prospective member who felt that the requirement for sponsorship was off putting as he didn't know anyone in the club. Bill Vroman checked the National application and found that sponsorship is optional on it. The pros and cons of this was discussed.

Dan Sobczyk asked the board members to talk up the free memberships. Any applications we receive are then sent to the Board for approval. He also told Andy Voss that he had done a good job on the roster.

2. **Publication**- Nothing to report

3. **Legislative**- Lee Nelson said there was nothing new on the Legislative front.

4. **Website**- Bill Vroman reported that he has been updating the website regularly and has posted the Swap Meet flyer prominently. Unfortunately there is still no progress on being able to pay on line. Dan Sobczyk said he would talk to his contact and have him get in touch with Bill.

5. **Archivist**- Chris Schurrer told the board that he had nothing new to report except that he had donated some old trophies to an organization that refurbishes them to use for charity events. Chris mentioned that if you have old trophies that you no longer want or need, that this is a worthwhile organization. He would be happy to take any members are willing to donate and get them to the charity.

6. **Car Show Manager**—Jim Sikora reported that he and Bob Markert had met with Bryan from Cantigny and they had discussed the date for the car show. They decided on July 23 because our usual date had a big name coming in the afternoon and we would have to vacate at an earlier time. The July 23 date would afford us more time to hold the show. Jim also told the board that they had decided on the theme for the show. They chose "Full Size Chevies and Fords" in the hope of drawing a bigger crowd. Rose O'Halloran suggested that all the feature cars be parked together. Bob Markert said that they follow the National guidelines and so park cars by class. Jim mentioned that they are hoping to eliminate parking problems by using taller markers which should be easier to see.

Activities:

1. **Swap Meet**—Bob Markert said that the Swap Meet is on its usual Sunday, the first Sunday of the month. The dealership has completed its remodeling and Bob showed pictures of the car bays after the remodel. Jerry Bodden let the board know that the BOP group had sent a letter to their vendors about our Swap Meet. Discussion ensued

Bob mentioned that he would like to get more members involved as sellers.

Some members of the board mentioned that they would take a table.

2. **Spring Tour**—Chris Schurrer reminded us that the Spring Tour is scheduled on May 18 to May 21 in the Freeport, Illinois area. He is finalizing the last of the tour stops. Generally, Thursday will tour out to Freeport; Friday will tour west toward Galena; Saturday will be centered in the Freeport area; and Sunday will be a tour back. Discussion ensued.

Chris mentioned that he hopes to have the registration form out by April 1. Also, the last day to book a room at the reduced rate is April 18.

3. **Fall Tour**—Lee Nelson told the board that the Fall tour will explore the area around Elkaeder, Iowa which is about 60 miles northwest of Dubuque. It is scheduled for the 3rd weekend of October.

Chapter Reports:

1. **Des Plaines Valley**—Lee Nelson said the chapter was gearing up after its winter hibernation. One of the things they did was to attend the Chicago Auto Show where they met Alexi Giannoulis, the current Secretary of State. He asked for suggestions on how to make his office function better and Rose O'Halloran made a suggestion that they make it easier to do a title search for old cars.

2. **Fox Valley**—Dan Sobczyk reported that his chapter had their Christmas party on January 28 at Old Warsaw. The food was delicious and the turnout was good. They elected new officers at this meeting. President: Dan Sobczyk, Vice President: Chris Schurrer, Secretary, Pat Markert, and Treasurer, Bob Markert. The chapter is planning a pizza party soon and is working on the Spring Tour.

3. **Silver Springs**—Al Matison said the chapter moved its Christmas party into December last year which was a change from their usual January. Everyone had a good time. Other than that, the chapter is busy working on their car show and flea market set for May 28. They are looking forward to a big turnout again this year.

4. **Waukegan/ North Shore**—Dan Helgren reported that the chapter had its pizza party on February 12th where they celebrated Bob Markert's birthday and awarded the Lichtfeld trophy to James Rubenstein and Linda Jacobs. The food was excellent, the room was spacious, the conversation was interesting. The chapter has also scheduled a St. Patrick's Day party for March 19 at Hackney's in Glenview.

At their February chapter meeting, Bill Vroman gave a demonstration of 3D printing. It was very well attended and seemed to generate a lot of interest. At their next chapter meeting, Maurer's auto electric demonstration and Ed Flynn will have a display of his paintings. In April, JoAnn Flynn will be hosting a game night.

Dan told us that a Memorial Service for Tom Risley will be held on May 6.

Old Business:

1. Business cards—Jim Sikora and Bill Vroman have been working on developing a card that could be given out when an antique car is seen in an attempt to recruit more members. Bill handed out an example. Comments included that the message was friendly but that the type was too small. It was suggested that the line containing the contact person and the website be increased in size. A motion was made by Ed Flynn to accept the card; second JoAnn Flynn. Motion passed. Jim Sikora will get some printed.

2. New Business—Jerry Bodden reported that the \$1000 donation to the building fund at National was used in the library in the rolling stacks. There is a plaque there saying "Donated by the Illinois Region."

Dan Sobczyk said that he has received a list of members who have joined since 2020. They will get a complimentary name tag. If any older members need to replace their tags, they should notify Dan; they will have to pay a replacement charge.

Andy Voss noted that he needs the new brochures.

3. Visitor input—None

4. Next Board Meeting—June 10 hosted by the Silver Springs Chapter at the Earl Township Building, 1506 E. Highway 34, Earlville, IL

5. Meeting adjourned: Motion to adjourn by Al Matison; second Jim Sikora; passed Meeting adjourned at noon.

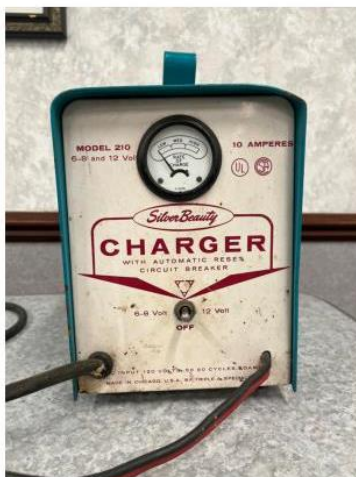
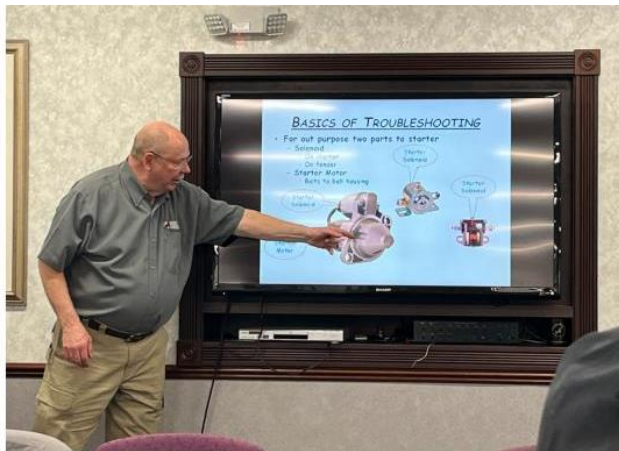

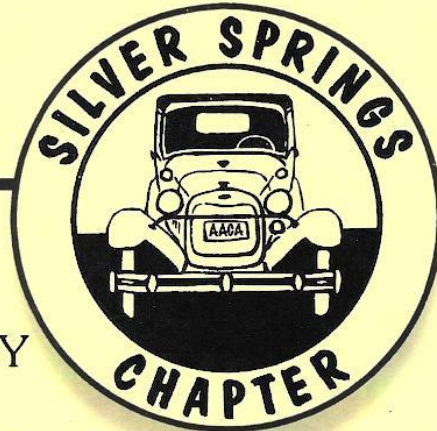

Do you have old trophies which you are not sure what to do with? The Illinois Region Archives has a pipeline for trophies to have a new lease on life and be used in charity car shows around Northern Illinois.

The person who takes care of this is based out Princeton and is the DJ host for many shows in his area. He also hosts many free / fundraiser shows for different charities. For these shows, he takes old trophies and adds new badges to them to give at these charity events.
