## Monthly Recipe

## Creamy Cucumber Pasta Salad



#### Ingredients

- 1 English Cucumber
- $\frac{1}{2}$  lb. med. sized pasta rotini or penne 1 small white onion

#### Dressing

- ½ cup Sour Cream
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup Mayonnaise
- 2 Tbsp. Vinegar
- ½ tsp. Salt
- 2 Tbsp. Fresh Dill Black pepper to taste



#### Instructions

- 1. Combine all dressing ingredients in a small bowl and mix well. Set aside.
- 2. Thinly slice onion and place in a bowl of cold water. (see note)
- 3. Cook pasta al dente according to package directions. Run under cold water to stop cooking.
- 4. Cut cucumber in half lengthwise and remove seeds using a spoon. Slice into thin slices.
- 5. Toss all ingredients in a large bowl. Let sit at least 40 minutes before serving.

#### **Notes**

Soaking the onions in cold water is optional but takes a bit of the "bite" out of the onion.


#### Waukegan/North Shore May Meeting






McClure's has been in existence since 1910, when it was opened by Rowley McClure as a Ford sales and service dealership. The McClure family has been in Lake County since at least 1836, as Thomas McClure, one of the early settlers, was one of 3 men who laid out the Milwaukee Road.

McClure's is now run by the fourth and fifth generation of McClures, Jack Fallos and his sons. Jack has an amazing collection of memorabilia displayed around the shop and also brought out much more for us to review.

## Spring tour SPRINGS into fun in Freeport

This was one of the most interesting and fun tours I have ever attended. I think several things explained this. First, we had four glorious days of beautiful spring weather. Second, we hit a variety of interesting and varied venues. Third, after a long and dreary winter, everyone on the tour was ready to have a good time.

The tour started at the McDonald's in Woodstock. We all managed not only to show up, but to get there on time. It was a good beginning to the day.

Off we went on our great adventure. First stop was at the Vintage Wings and Wheels Museum in Poplar Grove.





This museum is dedicated to the history of transportation from 1903 to 1957. This is a beautiful museum with exhibits spread over several buildings. As well as vehicles, this group has saved several buildings celebrating vehicle history



This Sunoco Station was built in 1924 and was moved here from Dayton Ohio. Don Schreiber's 1931 Ford Model A looks right at home here.

The next stop was at Sport & Specialty Restorations which specialize in preserving vintage sports cars.

Friday of the tour we started out with a lovely drive through Le-Aqua-Na State Recreation area which was acquired in 1948. The name is a combination of the nearby town of Lena and the Latin word for water, aqua. This beautiful park offered a lovely start to a busy day.





Leaving the beauty of the state park, we drove over to Torkeleson's Cheese. Since Kraft Cheese company started in this area, it was mandatory to make a cheese stop and Torkelson's is considered one of the best cheese stores.

Last stop of the day was the Freeport Art Museum. This was an interesting stop as they do all kinds of workshops here to inspire budding artists. This meant the works shown were varied and wonderful.

Saturday started out with a trip through one of the favorites of local residents—Krape Park. This is a truly lovely drive. The park has swan boats to ride, a



carousel to thrill and an absolutely picturesque drive.

Next we went to the Silver Creek Train Museum for a train ride.







The first engine was purchased by this group in 1982 and these dedicated people have been working hard to preserve railroad memorabilia ever since, including actually laying the track for the train to run on. What an interesting stop. Not only a train ride, but a museum of items from various time periods and several buildings filled with engines and train parts in various stages of restoration. Yu could easily spend an entire day here. However, we had to move on.

Our next stop was American Garage Art where we got a surprise! They greeted us with a 5 piece band who serenaded us for over an hour while we perused the art and rum-

maged around in the work spaces.

They had a great collection of T-shirts including one that said "Pretzels Rock." I suggested that Chris Schurrer buy it to add to his growing collection of pretzel shirts. He did. They also had a nice collec-

tion of antique toys.



I met the artist who painted all these pictures. They were beautiful and I wound up buying a print of the waterfall in Krape Park that he had painted. He grew up in Freeport and told me that at one time you were allowed to climb up the rocks on the side of the waterfall. He did it several times as a kid. Of

course, you can no longer do that. But it must have been fun.

Leaving American Garage Art, we headed to Union Dairy for lunch. This was one of my favorite lunch stops. I loved the grilled cheese sandwich with bacon and, of course, the ice cream is spectacular. This little shop opened as a dairy in 1914 and has been in business ever since.

Some members sat in the front

of the restaurant on the old fashioned stools. These included Jim and Laura McDonald, Linda Jacobs and Andy Voss.

Others went into the back room to gather.

I am not going to try to identify everyone in this picture but, let me tell you, we were loud and hungry. Food was yummy. Ice cream even better.



Next door to the Dairy was the site of the second Lincoln-Douglas debate. It sits in a lovely little park and was a very lovely and relaxing pause in a hectic day.



Last stop of the day was the Stephenson County Museum. Set in a shady and peaceful park, they gave us tours of their collections.




BOAT: Nope. I am not going to try to identify all these happy boaters. But, by the looks on their faces, they are obviously having a good time.


