Monthly Recipe



Ingredients

1 16 oz. pound cake, cut up in 1-inch cubes.

1-pint strawberries, sliced with 1 cup reserved.

1-pint blueberries with a $\frac{1}{2}$ cup reserved

1 16oz frozen whipped topping, thawed.

Instructions

In a trifle bowl or large glass serving bowl, layer half the pound cake, strawberries, blueberries, and whipped topping. Repeat layers once more then garnish with reserved berries in a flag pattern, as shown. Serve immediately or refrigerate until ready to serve.

BOARD MEETING

Date: 6/10/23

Hosts: Silver Springs

Location: Somonauk Public Library

1. **Welcome**—President Dan Sobczyk called the meeting to order at 10:40 am. He thanked the Silver Springs Chapter for hosting the meeting and providing the refreshments. He then asked the Secretary to call the roll.

Roll Call—Pat Markert called the roll. Present: Dan Sobczyk, Chris Schurrer, Bob Wenderski, Bill Vroman, Rose O'Halloran, Nancy Nelson, Lee Nelson, Bibana Garcia, Jerry Bodden, Al Matison, Andy Voss, Jim Sikora., JoAnn Flynn, Ed Flynn

Dan Helgren excused with Chris Schurrer as proxy

Visitors: Humberto Garcia, Joan Bodden, Joanna Vroman and Bob Markert

Secretary Report: Pat Markert remarked that her discussion with Sue Eitner from National has continued. There are still 4 members who have not paid their National dues. Pat recommended that these members be dropped from the membership rolls thereby receiving no emails about events and no further copies of Sidelights. Discussion ensued but it was decided to follow this course.

Pat also notified the board that the National wants the list of new officers each year and the list of members sent to the National by January 31. That means the roster must be finalized by that date and anyone not paid by then will be dropped from the roster. There was much discussion about members who receive the first year free. It was noted that these need to reminded that the second year they must pay not only the Region but also the National dues. Andy Voss, membership said he would stress for new members when he sends out the renewals.

Pat also asked if we should collect BOTH Region and National dues for members. Discussion ensued. Bibiana Garcia made a motion to leave things as they are now; second Al Matison. Passed.

Treasurer's report- Bob Wenderski reported that since the balance reported in March, there have been receipts for the Swap Meet and Membership payments. There were also expenses from the Swap Meet, Sidelights and membership payments to chapters. This leaves a balance slightly lower than March. Bob also pointed out that there are 116 paid members and 4 complimentary members this year. Andy Voss asked if this included Lifetime members and Bob said no. A motion was made by Andy Voss to accept the Treasurer's Report; second Jim Sikora. Passed.

Chris Schurrer suggested Andy make a list of the duties involved so it is clear which duties Andy would keep doing and which duties need to assigned elsewhere. One duty of the membership team to keep the Region brochure up to date. JoAnn Flynn had taken on that duty and said she would be happy to keep that job.

The sticking point seems to be the manning of the membership table at various venues. A person with good people skills and sales ability is needed. Andy will make a list of duties and the board will discuss this further at the next meeting.

Andy also asked about doing renewals totally on line, including payments. Bill Vroman said that the widget that is needed to do online payments would cost about \$400/year plus about 5.25/transaction. Humberto Garcia suggested adding a transactijon fee of \$1 or \$2 to offset the cost.

Bill Vroman also brought to the board's attention that going to online payments, may have tax implications if we are not a 501c3. Discussion ensued. Dan Sobczyk asked Bill to look into it further.

- Publication: no report
- Legislative: Lee Nelson reported that as of July 1, 2023, the gasoline tax will go from \$.0329/gal to \$.0640/ gal. This is the fourth highest gasoline tax in the country. He also informed the board that the fee to make a title transfer will go from \$155 to \$165. In addition, Lee felt there are 2 bills in the Legislature that we should know about. The first would mandate that by 2025 all government vehicles need to be zero emissions. The second bill would tie the gasoline tax to the inflation rate. Lee felt this was done so that politicians won't be blamed for increases in the tax.
- Website: Bill Vroman said that much of his report had already been discussed in the Membership report. However, he added that if the board decides how to deal with this before summer's end, he could have it up and running in time for membership renewals.

He also said he had, as usual, updated the website. He mentioned that the last issue of the National publication had an article on cars and music. Much of that article was on the song "In my Merry Oldsmobile." He has downloaded a link to the Merry Olds cartoon on the website.

- Archivist: Archivist- Chris Schurrer started his report by thanking all those who
 donated trophies to his friend for charitable purposes. He then asked if anyone
 would be going to a National show this year. Chris has a number of magazines he
 would like to donate to National. He was hoping that if you are going and had room,
 you would be willing to take some. Dan Sobczyk said he was going to the Quad Cities in July and would take some.
- Car Show Manager: Jim Sikora reported that the car show, by vote of the board, has been cancelled for this year. There has been a change in management at Cantigny and each time we talked with our liason, Bryan, he would tell us to wait 2 more weeks. It finally became to late to put on the show. The new vjision for Cantigny is no more car shows after their own in September/ no charitable events/ change in fee structure, moving from a per car charge to a per person charge. Now Sunday fee is \$30 per car and will become \$30 per person.

So, Jim went on, we are looking for a new venue. He has gotten several

suggestions and is open to more. He said each and every suggestion will be checked by himself and Bob Markert. They are looking for a venue that is reasonable to rent and

3. Activities:

• Swap Meet—Bob Markert reported that the Swap Meet was also plagued with problems this year. The dealer where we have had the meet was bought out by another dealer and it was some time before we knew if they would let us use their facility. When we got the go ahead, it was further delayed because Chevrolet had required the dealer to overhaul and update the area where our meet would take place. Luckily it was done swiftly and we got word toward the end of February that the meet was a go. Considering all the problems, the Swap Meet went well. Although we had fewer vendors than before, all seemed pleased with their sales. Seems the public was in a mood to buy as almost everyone who attended walked out carrying merchandise. Thanks to the Silver Springs Chapter we got a food truck vendor just 2 days before the meet. Santiago was very pleased with his sales and wants us to call him for next year. We were pleased as the food was very good.

The Swap Meet had expenses of \$1,100.79 and income of \$1,415.00 leaving a profit of \$314.21. The Swap Meet Committee was very pleased.

- Spring Tour—Chris Schurrer reported that the Fox Valley Chapter had hosted the Spring tour to Freeport. It was a such a big success that we ran out of rooms at the hotel. The hotel was very nice and was very cheap. The weather was very co-operative with sunny days and lovely temperatures. There was a total of 26 cars and 44 people attending who enjoyed a variety of venues. All the people we met at every venue seemed happy to have us and asked us to come back again.
- Fall Tour—Lee Nelson reported that we would be going to Elkader, Iowa in the fall. While he is still looking for a hotel, he told the board that there is a lovely Opera House there that was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1976. They are, while we are there, performing Peter Pan and the tentative plan is to attend the play on Friday night. Lee noted that there are lots of things to see and do in that area and they are working on picking out our stops.

- Fox Valley—Dan Sobczyk reported that the chapter is planning a tour on July 23 to Sanfilippo Estate in Barrington. Also on August 26, the chapter is joining the classic car club, in conjunction with the Geneva Concourse, to the Elgin Historical Museum. The cost is \$25 and includes admission and a box lunch.
- Silver Springs—Al Matison said the chapter had just finished another successful car show. The group is also planning a tour on July 1 to the Illinois waterway and the LaSalle Historical museum near Utica.
- Waukegan-North Shore—Chris Schurrer said that their dust off tour went to the Lake County area with lunch at Crosswords and a stop at the home of long time member, Jim Manz. Jim has a beautiful home and an exciting collection of exquisite cars. Tour was made by Don Schreiber and Dan Helgren.
