

# THE PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

On March 19, The Windy City Chapter of the American Truck Historical Society had a tour of the Fire Museum of Greater Chicago which is housed in what used to be the Engine 123 Quarters on south Western Avenue in Chicago. The building was opened in 1916 and was not used by the Chicago Fire Department after 1974.

When entering, you first encounter an ex-

cellent restoration of a 1928 Ahrens - Fox fire truck, as well as a 1930 White squad and a 1931 Model T chemical. There were many items to see, such as, old wooden fire plug alarm boxes, a scaling ladder, jakestand for dispatch-

ing, a speaking trumpet and much more. There were several action photos of fire equipment and fire sites, of fire stations and major fire sites.

The most significant part of the day was the excellent presentation by Andy O'Donnell and Jack Connors. Who have been firemen, commanders and fire academy trainers. I learned a lot about fire fighting, managing the fire business and training, from the early days of fire fighting history, through the expansion and growth of a major city fire department.

After the tour at the museum, we travelled about half a mile to a facility that is used to restore fire trucks; they currently have nine. They range from pumpers, ladder trucks, big water canyons and exhaust fire trucks. Fire truck enthusiasts would really love this collection.



Editor: I asked Judy to share some of her favorite recipes. This is one she shared.

### Elvis Presley Cake

1 box white cake mix

8 oz. can crushed pineapple in it's own juice

1 c. sugar

8 oz. cream cheese

1/2 c. butter

3 c. powdered sugar

1 tsp. vanilla

2 c. crushed pecans



Bake cake according to package directions in a 9 X 12 pan. Cool and poke holes in the cake with a fork.

Boil crushed pineapple with sugar; pour this over the cooled cake and let it soak in.

Mix cream cheese, butter, powdered sugar and vanilla. Stir in crushed pecans, mixing well. Frost cake carefully so pineapple doesn't mix with frosting.

About 40 people were in attendance with a few members that we hadn't seen for a while.







At the March 12 Region Board meeting, the board took time to thank Don and Nancy for





# JORDAN SPEED WAY SERIES

Jordan is introducing for 1930 an entirely newline of automobiles in addition to the regular lines of cars which are continued with slight changes and refinements.

The new line, known as the Speedway Series, carries a power plant of the eight cylinder in line type.




Jordan Speedway Series Sportsman

This series is a much larger, higher priced and more luxurious line than Jordan has ever before produced. The motor is said to develop 125 horse power and factory officials claim better than 100 miles an hour through a four-speed transmission in which the fourth speed is known as "over direct."

The wheel base is 145 inches and the two bodies, one open and one enclosed, are of aluminum, custom-built by Coburn.

The enclosed model, which is extremely European in line and contour, is of the four door,

five passenger type and both the front and rear seats may be divided by dropping down a heavily upholstered arm which folds into the back cushions.

The open model has an

almost circular, airplane-type cockpit for the driver and one passenger. One seat slides forward admitting two people to a roomy rumble seat with out the customary climbing up over the fender or side of the car, yet the rumble seat

can be entirely closed up if only two people ride.

The head lamps, which are said to have been influenced in design by the lighting fixtures on the steamship Bremen, are high and narrow with a triangular lens.


Such details as the front splasher and gas tank cover, as well as the side fillers, have been worked out with minute attention.

There is a spacious baggage compartment in the rear of both the enclosed and open models. While no price has been announced, it is understood that these two cars will sell in the custom price field.

These two models, known as the Sportsman and the Ace, and quite different in appearance from the cars we are accustomed to seeing on the streets. The hood, for instance, runs from radiator to windshield without a break at the cowl line. There is no visible filler cap on the radiator, just a raised linelike a gun sight. Fenders are individual and are not attached to the conventional running board. The running boards themselves are made in the shape of the cross-section of an airplane wing and carry built-in red and green turning lights.

The airplane influence is also apparent in the instrument board which is of a typical airplane type—with aviator's compass, altimeter and an instrument for showing the number of engine revolutions per minute.

At the right hand side of the board there is a dial which tunes in a concealed radio which is

standard equipment. Upholstery and colors are entirely at the option of the purchaser.

A man of average height can easily look over the top of the car, yet there is the customary road clearance and plenty of headroom inside


