

In the June Sidelights, I included a "Brass Corner" column on Grant and Gini Ross' acquiring a 1925 Columbia Electric. Shortly after the paper came out, Bill Winslow, long time Region member, called me. This is the story he told me. NOTE: Bill, if I get any of this wrong, I apologize.

Bill said that at the same time that Grant bought the Columbia, he bought a 1925 Detroit Electric, both from the Museum of Science and Industry when that museum was selling off some of their collection.


The tour this year is on August 7th. We will again meet at McDonalds and tour to the museum. Once we are there, we will be parked together. Be sure to send the registration form to the museum.





#### ZESTY SALMON PATTIES


I found this recipe some years ago. It reminded me of the salmon patties my Mom made when I was young. I add extra horseradish because I like the extra kick.

Guest: Dick Murray and Jerry Bodden.

Secretary's Report: No corrections or changes - Chris Schurrer moved to accept the report. Nancy Nelson seconded. Motion passed.

Treasurer's Report: Bob Markert reported for Joe Dolezal - beginning balance \$12,400.69. Income of \$3,358.45. Expenses of \$658.28 leaving an ending balance of \$15,100.86. Bob pointed out the income included the sale of some of the literature/books of the Leonard Pal donation and we have 4 boxes remaining. Pat Markert moved to accept the Treasurer's report. Shirley Salm seconded. Motion passed.

#### Standing Committee Reports:

Membership - Pat Hart reported for Linda Dolezal that there were three new members, two renewals and three had been removed for a new total of 196.

**Publications** - Pat Markert reported she had nothing new.

Website - Dan Sobczyk reported website was current. He informed the board that the color had been changed to hopefully make it more readable. He also indicated the font could not be enlarged. Lastly, the Region website linked to the National website could only be eliminated by the person who posted it.

**Legislation:** Lee Nelson reported nothing new except the State of Illinois will have different driver license procedures.

Archivist: Chris Schurrer reported things are quiet except for the Leonard Pal collection. There are 4 boxes remaining, he might have someone who is interested them. The club had an income of \$1,600 so far.

#### Region Activities:

Region Car Show 2016 - Bob Markert reported all in place, contract signed, etc. A meeting of the car show committee will occur after the board meeting and lunch. The date is 7-24-16 at Cantigny in Wheaton. Featured cars will be 1940s because region is 70 years old and the 1980's cars to attract collectors with newer vehicles.

Fall Tour 2016 - Silver Springs - Al Matison reported the tour will be in Princeton area. Rick and Chris have been working on it. The date is October 20-22 and the hotel and banquet facilities have been arranged.

#### Chapter Reports:

Chris Schurrer made a motion to change the Spring tour to 2 days on Saturday/Sunday for a trial period of three years. Motion passed. Objection: Lee Nelson. Starts with Spring 2017, Fox Valley will host and Des Plaines Chapter, will do the fall tour.

2) Board is looking for members to take over the job of Membership Chair since Joe & Linda Dolezal will be retiring.


**Visiting Members Comments:** Dick Murray thanked the board for all the work they do in putting things together, touring etc.




