My Country Lemon Pie Filling:

4 egg yolks

1 c. sugar

5 TBS cornstarch

4 TBS lemon juice

2 c. water

1/2 tsp salt

2 Tbs. butter

Meringue

4 egg whites

1/2 tsp cream of tartar

8 tsp. sugar

A 9" pie crust)

(your choice, homemade or bought)



Combine sugar and cornstarch in sauce pan.
Gradually add lemon juice, water, salt. Stir to
keep from getting lumpy or sticking to pan cook
until thick. Remove from heat and stir in butter.
Pour into pie shell.

For meringue, beat egg whites. Add cornstarch and add sugar gradually. Beat until stiff. Spread on top of filling. Bake at 350° until meringue is light brown (at least 10-12 minutes).


