HISTORY CENTER OF WASHINGTON COUNTY

March 2018

One of the places we will be visiting this spring is the History Center of Washington



The Old County Courthouse

County located in the Old Courthouse. Washington County, which originally extended to Lake Michigan, was laid out by the Territorial Legislature in 1836 and named for George Washington. After a long and bitter argument over the location of the county seat, the county was divided in two and in 1853. Washington County chose West Bend as its county seat. At that time, 4 families donated land to the county in perpetuity for county buildings. The site is best known as "the Square." The Square rises above the surrounding area and is the perfect location for prominent buildings.

The first buildings were a wood frame courthouse, a wood frame jailhouse, and a stone

and brick county records building.

The county approved funds in November 1888 for a new courthouse. After only 10 months' construction, the new courthouse was finished and held its first court session in March 1890.

Architecturally, the 1889 Washington County Courthouse is an 8-story masterpiece in the style of Romanesque Revival, characterized by repeating rounded arches, monochromatic brick and stone, towers, spires, and multiple dormers.



One of the featured exhibits is the 27 room doll-house which was built over several decades by the Zinn family of Milwaukee. Lorna Zinn eventually donated the dollhouse to the West Bend Gallery of Fine Art. In 2012, the dollhouse found a new home at the Old Courthouse Museum. After nearly a year of restoration work, the dollhouse exhibit opened to the public in 2013.


