Carrot Soup

Ingredients

- 2lbs. carrots (12-14)
- 1 potato (8-9 ounces)
- 3 ounces unsalted butter
- 1 sm. onion, peeled and diced (1/2 cup)

Monthly Recipe

- 1 lg garlic clove
- 1 tsp. ground coriander
- 4 cups chicken broth
- ½ tsp. sugar
- $\frac{1}{4}$ tsp. salt
- 2 cups milk
- Freshly ground pepper
- 2-3 tblspns. Dry sherry

Instructions

- 1. Peel carrots and cut crosswise into $\frac{1}{2}$ inch pieces. (5-6) cups) Peel potato and cut into small cubes. ($1\frac{1}{2}$ cups)
- 2. In large saucepan over medium-low heat, melt butter. Add onions and saute while stirring occasionally, until translucent. (5-6 min.) Add garlic and saute while stirring until in changes color. Add carrots, potatoes and coriander and saute, stirring a couple of times, (2-3 min)
- 3. Add the chicken broth, sugar and salt and over medium heat bring to a simmer, lower heat cover partially and simmer until vegetables are soft. (20-25 minutes)
- 4. In a food processor with its metal blade attached or a blender, process the vegetables in small batches, with the broth, until a smooth puree.
- 5. Return to saucepan and add milk and pepper to taste. Place over medium heat and heat to almost a boil. Taste for seasoning and adjust if necessary. If too thick, add more milk. Before serving stir in the sherry to taste.
- 6. Note: You may top with sour cream & chopped cilantro.

Vintage Photos & a bit of History:

SOME ILLINOIS REGION members may recall car restorer Bill Hill. I'm not sure if he was ever an AACA member. He'd squeeze a nickel until Jefferson cried, and he tipped waitresses so meagerly, he always complained when they walked past him with a full pot of coffee. Me, they'd pour, while ignoring Bill. Whatever his faults, he could pound on a piece of metal and turn it into something else. As I grew up four doors away from Bill Van Dyken, Bill Hill's best friend, both Bill's were close acquaintances.

Some thirty years ago I accompanied Hill on a trip to Pennsylvania one year, in the fall. It wasn't for Hershey and I don't recall if we picked up a car, but through his connections in a blacksmith association, Bill had a lot of friends who were not car collectors. We stopped in one small town, visited a fellow blacksmith who put him onto a man with an underslung chassis in the garage. It had a complete engine and drivetrain, no body, and we id'ed it as a Regal. The old guy also had a human skull in his garage. He dug it up in the culvert when they were putting in a drainage tile. Interesting thing was, it had a three-sided hole in the skull, and a three-pointed bayonet sticking out of it. The guy figured it was someone from the French Indian War who met an untimely end. Bill was going to go back for the Regal.

The old guy sends us to a private collection in a metal building. That guy has an electric trolley car, and overhead catenary so he can drive the trolley into and out the building. That's as far as the tracks went. Surrounding the trolley was a collection of unremarkable old cars. The only one I recall was a pre-war Fiat roadster that needed everything.

The next blacksmith lead was a *real* old guy, and his claim was he had the negatives from the old Uniontown PA board racetrack. ALL of them. Was he the photographer? I don't recall, but he was pushing if not past ninety, and blind.

Our last interesting blacksmith lead was another fellow, a conservation officer who had two old cars. The nice one was a shovel-nose Packard sedan, which the Packard guys identify right around '32 or '33. I'm not sure if this is a Full Classic, I think it is now. The car was parked in 1955 in an old, closed-down roadhouse, where the lower level garage access was reachable by driving around to the back of the property, not readily apparent from the front. It was in nice shape. In a tumble-down garage off to the side was a LaFayette. This was a lower price car made by Nash in Kenosha. It appeared to be a '37. An uncommon if not especially desirable car, except this was a convertible coupe!

It was in poor condition; in fact, the dashboard was rusted clean in half from where water poured in. Bill looked at it, commented "Easy restoration."

And for him, it would have been.

Bill was going to go back, get the Regal, follow up on the Packard and Nash, acquire the racing negatives. And never did. I'm not the kind of person who screws a pal out of a lead, but this would have been the right time. Those negatives are probably gone, and irreplaceable...

Which brings us to the three photos we're sending Laura this month, acquired a few weeks ago at the swap in West Bend Wisconsin. The seller was Ralph, the title guy. He had a three-ring binder of old photos, I thumbed through, but how much? He said \$5 apiece, so I brought these home. Photo number one is a Packard sedan, as described above, though the pictured car is two-tone. It is sitting on a dealership floor, somewhere. Maybe our Packard friends have seen this shot before and can provide details.

Photo number two is a wrecked automobile, a Paige. It may have been a coupe. Maybe around 1920. The location is not identified, the gentleman in the background with a cap looks like he may be a Canadian provincial police officer. In my 1926 National Used Car 'Red Book' (in fact, this came from the Paige-Jewett Sales Corp of Anderson, IN) a six-year old Paige coupe appraises at \$26.



It's Hoot again, standing next to a low-slung Ruxton sedan. I bid twenty bucks; it goes for over fifty, beyond my meager allowance.

Ask Roy Nelson to tell you about his girlfriend someday, the one with two noses. Roy says she wasn't much to look at, but she sure smelled good.... Back when we needed patrons to join AACA, Roy was mine, in 1975. He's an on-again, off-again kind of member, probably more one than another, but Roy attended an auction in Valparaiso recently. He said a pretty nice '29 Hudson coupe with wood wheels, older restoration, sold for \$5,500. A couple of other square cars didn't bring much either, he thinks it's a softening of the square market. The car he went to bid on, an open Franklin touring did go for over ten grand. Roy bid it up to just shy of the winning bid. Roy and his brother, DVC chairman Lee own a nice mostly restored Franklin convertible coupe. It's in Lockport at their shop, Franklin Motors. Lee hopes to get the interior done soon, the plan was to haul it down to Oklahoma this year, but Covid-19 has thrown a monkey in that plan...
