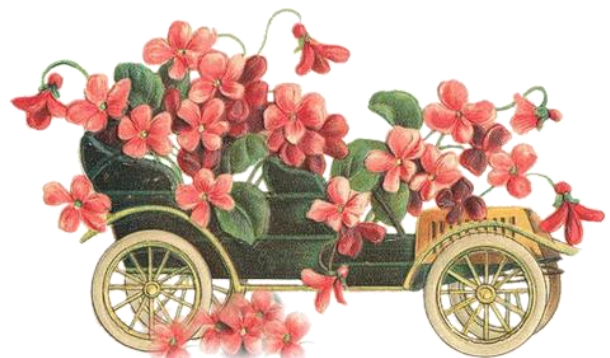

Donald Juday Memorial

Don Juday, age 82 of Sun City, Arizona, passed away on Sunday, April 21, 2024.

Born on February 7, 1942 in Mishawaka, Indiana, Don went on to graduate from St Joseph High School in 1959. He earned a BA from Elmhurst College in 1963 and an MA from Northern Illinois University in 1966. He met his wife Nancy when they both were first year teachers with the same free period at Downers Grove North High School. They were married in 1965.

Don was a committed educator, teaching students both at the high school and college level in speech, English, and communications. He was the debate coach, drama tech director and faculty advisor for Elmhurst College's radio station (WRSE). Later in his career, he combined his love of teaching with administration, overseeing adult education programs at the college level.

Instilled with a strong sense of volunteerism, Don was an active member of St Louise de Marillac parish in LaGrange Park, Illinois. Aside from being a lector and Eucharistic Minister, he was a member and president of the Men's Club and the Parish Council. He and Nancy were in charge of the Environment Committee for several years and were recipients of the Christifideles Award in 2013, bestowed by the Archdiocese of Chicago for devoted service.

He was also an active member of the Knights of Columbus, holding various state and local offices over the years. Also, along with Nancy, he was a weekly facilitator at Hinsdale Hospital's New Day Center for 20 years.

Don had a lifelong passion for antique/classic cars. Coming from the South Bend, Indiana area, he was particularly taken with Studebakers. After his retirement, he purchased his first antique car and became active in local car clubs, holding several offices, including President of the Illinois Region of AACA.

In 2016, Don and Nancy left behind the snow and cold of the Midwest and moved to Sun City, Arizona. They joined St Clement of Rome parish in Sun City where Don reprised his roles as a Eucharistic Minister and a lector. He also became involved in local car clubs, including C.A.R.S. of Sun Cities where he has most recently served as president.

Don was a devoted husband, father, "papa"/grandfather and friend. His smile, laugh, and sense of humor will be missed by many. He is survived by his beloved wife of 58 years, Nancy (née Heidenreich). He is also survived by three children: Holly (Richard) Davidson of Warminster, England; David (Theresa) Juday of Phoenix, Arizona; and Kevin (Lisa) Juday of Tinley Park, Illinois. He is the proud grandfather of Josef Bielanski, Tia Juday, Parker Bielanski, Calleigh Juday, and Reagan Juday.

A Mass of Christian Burial will be held at St Louise de Marillac Church, 1144 Harrison Ave, La Grange Park, Illinois, 60526, on Saturday, May 18th at 10:30 am and will be followed by a Celebration of Life.

Monthly Recipe



My French Onion Soup Recipe

It's simple, but technique is everything so DON'T SKIP OR CHEAT THE STEPS.

6 cups sliced onions

6 cloves garlic, minced

12 T Butter (yes, 12 tablespoons, or a stick and a half)

1 t Salt

6 cups beef stock

1 cup Mushroom stock (I use Better than Bouillon for both)

Salt & Pepper

1 t dried thyme.

1/4 cup dry sherry or dry white wine (I use Champagne or Chablis)

sliced French bread, toasted

Shredded Swiss cheese

Shredded gruyere cheese

Slowly cook and caramelize the onions and garlic in the butter. This takes about 45 minutes, but the time is worth it.

Once the onions are well caramelized, stir in ONE CUP of beef stock and cook over low heat until the stock is nearly evaporated.

Slowly stir in the rest of the stock. Bring to a boil and reduce to a low simmer.

Season to taste. Stir in the wine or sherry and simmer again for a few minutes.

Preheat oven to 425. DON'T USE THE BROILER.

Spoon soup into oven-proof bowls. float bread slices, then a mixture of both cheeses into each bowl, and mound it up a little.

Bake for about 12 - 15 minutes at 425. The baking time will vary based on the shape of the bowls and temperature of the soup. You can leave it in longer to brown the cheese but 15 minutes is typically more than enough time for a good melt and brown.

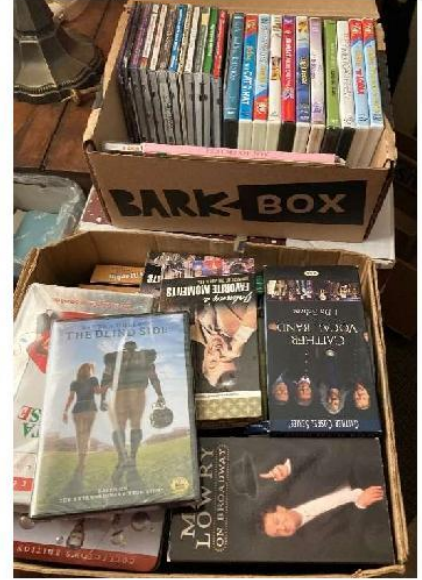

The Galena Illinois Spring Tour, hosted by the Waukegan/North Shore Chapter, May 2-4, 2024 will be good to include in your event calendar.



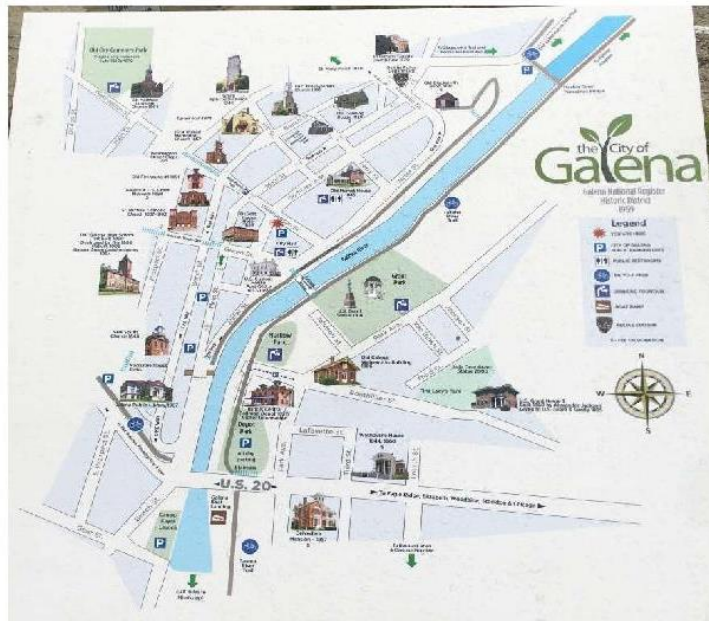

They are activities that make you feel safe and happy. A few of mine are building model cars and taking my Corvair for a Sunday morning ride.

What do Comfort Zones have to do with the AACA - Illinois Region's annual car show? This will be the 73rd. car show and a lot of things have changed, some of these changes have been good and some not so much. A few of the changes we wish were not happening are the fact the Region is getting older, and our membership is not growing, new members are getting harder to find. We also depend on a few members to do most of the work. This must stop! These fine folks are getting burned out, and we need to change this.

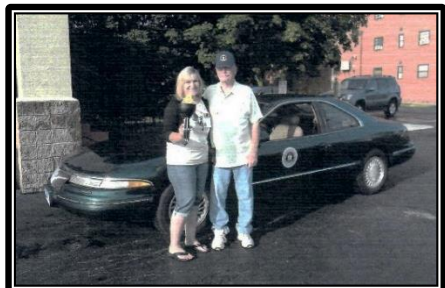
