Monthly Recipe



Asparagus Casserole Submitted by Laura Cielenski

Ingredients:

- 1 stack crushed Ritz Crackers
- 2 15oz. can asparagus pieces (drained) or
- 2 Frzn drained asparagus pieces
- 3 hard-boiled eggs, sliced
- 1 can cream of mushroom soup
- 1 small can evaporated milk (60z)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ stick butter (40z)
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. shredded cheddar cheese

Directions:

Spread $\frac{3}{4}$ of the crackers on bottom of casserole dish. Layer asparagus and then sliced eggs. In a saucepan combine and heat soup, milk, butter & $\frac{3}{4}$ cheese. Pour over eggs & asparagus. (Make sure it goes to bottom a bit.) Top with rest of cheese & cracker crumbs.

Bake @ 400 degrees for 30 minutes.

Friend Jeff phoned this afternoon to inform of Frank's passing around 3:00 AM today. It was our understanding that Frank was going to live forever. He and I flew out to San Diego, November 2022; Frank bought this coupe sight unseen and we drove it back to Illinois. I was a passenger in Frank's 1923 Overland when the crank blew last summer. He had it apart, rebuilt with a new crank a few weeks later. Indefatigable. That was how I described him. Frank was early to mid-eighties, retired from owning a blow moulding shop, and in retirement continued on as a racing mechanic. He leaves kids, grandkids, one or two great grandkids; a house that looks like a prop in a horror film, Willys-Knights and Overlands, a passel of Corvairs, some post-war Continentals, this coupe and a tudor, and more friends than you can count on your digits.

May 2

The first participating members started the tour on an overcast morning in Libertyville, IL. with the threat of rain. We headed to Rockton IL for our first stop where several more members joined us. The Rockton Mayor, John Peterson, came to greet us with Tricia Dudich who is the Planning and Development administrator for the village. Tricia provided us with a guided tour of Rockton history. The Tour explained the meaning behind their murals, the age of their buildings, how the river affected the growth of their town, and an interesting place for lunch followed by some free time to explore the town.










Leaving Rockton and continuing on our route we followed the winding and hilly stagecoach trail into Galena. Posing the question of "How did the horse drawn carriages make it through these roads?" Our first tour day ended at the Chestnut Mountain Resort in Galena, where several more members joined us in the hospitality room. The hospitality room's view of the Mississippi showed our day ending with only a

few raindrops and no major storms.









May 3
9:00 AM getting ready for our driver's meeting. We experienced a wonderful, beautiful sunny morning with the evidence that it had rained at night. We started with a short drive to Ulysses S. Grant's home, for a group photo opportunity and then to explore the grounds and a tour of the interior of the house.



After visiting US Grant's home, we drove into the town of Galena where Chris Schurrer had arranged admission to the Galena Historical US Grant Museum and the Dowling House to tour on our own time. The Dowling House is the oldest home in Galena built in 1826. Following the tour, many of our travelers participated in exploring the fine shops, historical buildings, trolley

tour, blacksmith, Galena Winery, and the challenge of the stairs on their own time. Our day ended in the hospitality room sharing wonderful stories of the day in Galena.













May 4


The tour route was to cover a little less than 100 miles. It was full of activities and the threat of severe thunderstorms! First stop, Badger mine, a museum in Shullsburg, WI. It is a lead mine that travels 5 miles underneath the town and is no longer in use. Visitors, after a safety briefing, were able to go into the mine



with a guide to explore. What a great opportunity!

















On the way to the second stop in Elizabeth, IL, we encountered the historical marker "Gravity Hill". If a car stops on the roadway at the road sign, puts their vehicle in neutral, the car will ascend backwards, cresting the top of the gravity hill at about 20 mph. However, due to time restraints, only a few of us were able to attempt this feat. Many of us suggested to put this on a future tour to come back and try it.

Arriving at Apple River Fort, we were greeted by a speaker explaining how they found the location of the original fort, its significance in history, and where the replica was built. We were able to walk up the road or drive our cars to view the replica of the

fort.











Next was the Chicago Great Western Depot Museum, and then lunch was on the list. The Depot Museum discussed the many trains that used to be in the area and were shut down. At the Depot Museum we were able to walk through a train car. Inside the depot they had replicas of model trains running on tracks. There were many different kinds of railroad memorabilia from books, dining car menus, track schedules, posters, and equipment.







Lola's Deli was our lunch stop. In 1975 this was the original stop for lunch. Same building, but back then it was called. Corral Restaurant.

The rest of the time was spent exploring the town of Elizabeth on our own with the many antique shops and a bike museum. The bike museum covered three floors. There were bikes from all different manufacturers and different time periods on display.









Returning on the road tour back to Chestnut Mountain, we stopped at the Mississippi Palisades State Park at Lookout Point. The view was spectacular. Many of us took the opportunity for a photo in front of the view. Some were lucky enough to see the eagles soaring across the Mississippi river.



After a fun packed day, and thankful for no thunderstorms, we attended the banquet at the Chestnut Mountain Resort. It was nice to not have to travel to another destination. This was a wonderful opportunity to socialize again and talk about our day's



activities. Dan Helgren, WNS Chapter President, thanked everyone for participating in this event. Chris Schurrer mentioned the tour was created based off the 1975 Galena tour and tried to stay as close to the Itinerary of the original tour.











May 5(optional on return trip)
Our homeward bound Road Tour led us through
beautiful winding scenic back roads of farms and
country. We had a rest stop at Canyon Park to take
a break and stretch our legs.









We finally hit the Beloit boundaries, back to civilization, where we could gas up our cars before heading to our final stop at the DC Winery for lunch and wine tasting. Enjoying our final moments outside at the beautiful winery we recapped a wonderful adventure together. Exchanging our farewells and heading in our own direction home.


