


Please remember that all meetings are open to the members.

Time called to order: 10:00 am

- Welcome—Pat Markert called the meeting to order. She explained that President, Dan Sobczyk, was on his honeymoon, Vice-President Chris Schurrer was tied up with business and Treasurer Bob Wenderski had to go to a funeral. Therefore, she was running the meeting. She thanked Bibiana Garcia for acting as secretary.
 - Roll Call—Pat Markert took the roll. Present: Jerry Bodden, Ed Flynn, Bibiana Garcia, Nancy Nelson, Rose O'Halloran, Rick Shaw, Dale Woosley, Lee Nelson, Al Matison, Dan Helgren, Bob Markert, Jim Sikora, Andy Voss, Bill Vroman.
 - Proxies: Len Woelfel proxy for Chris Schurrer, Dale proxy for Dan Sobczyk and Bob Markert proxy for Bob Wenderski.
 - Visitors: Cheryl Woosley and Humberto Garcia
 - Secretary report—Pat reported that she sent the minutes to the board and asked for corrections, deletions or additions. She received none She asked for a motion to approve the minutes as sent out. Such a motion was made by Al Matison; second, Bill Vroman.
 - Pat commented that she was not as busy this term as she had been last meeting. She only sent out 152 messages since the September meeting.
 - **Treasurer report** Bob Markert reported on this month's treasurer's report. This month we had deposits mostly from membership dues; expenses including 2 issues of Sidelights, supplies for the ballot committee and payments of chapter dues.

2. Old Business: Pat said she went through the September minutes and made a list of items that need to be updated.

*Follow up #1: adjust order of meeting. As you see, I adjusted the order of the meeting. Therefore, we are doing Old Business first. Done.

*Follow up #2: Legislative Committee Chair and Archivist stay for another year? Because they were not at the last meeting, Pat Markert asked Lee Nelson if he was willing to serve another year as Legislative Chair. He said yes. Pat also said she had talked to Chris Schurrer and he is willing to serve another year as archivist

*Follow up #3: : Name badges: Dan said that they are on order.

*Follow up #4: By law change. I took vote of members. Only 48 opted to vote. We got 46 yes and 2 no.. Having passed, I sent the changes to National. It is approved. Pat said she would send out copies of the new by-laws to members.

*.Follow up #5: I sent 2 months of Sidelights to the people who signed up for more information at the last car show. I got no feedback at all.

*Follow up #7: It was suggested by Humberto Garcia in January that we get a list of National members who live in area and are not part of Illinois Region. No one seemed to follow up on it. So Pat contacted Sue Eitner who said they could look up 3 zip codes. Pat started to collect the zip codes to bring to the board when she noticed that most zip codes in this area begin with 60. She then contacted Pat Buckley at National who actually does the searches to see if we could search on just the 60 part of the zip code. We can and Pat Buckley sent a list of 309 names which includes our current members.

Pat wanted to know what they wanted to do now. Andy volunteered to go through the list and remove our currect members. Pat will see if Pat Buckley can send the list including the email addresses and phones.

*Follow up #8: Dash plaque sales. Pat said she had not followed up on getting this organized. She said she will get samples from Chris, scan them, and send out notices to members. I will try to accomplish soon. Christmas presents?

***Follow up #9:** Ballot Committee Report: Pat announced that we had FIVE members running for the board. Of the five, Bob Markert had talked to 4 of them about running. Congratulations to Bob for getting members to run.

3. New Business:

- A. Lichtfeld Trophy: Pat opened the floor up to nominations for this award. Bob Markert nominated the Woosleys; second, Rose O'Halloran. Dan Helgren nominated Don Schreiber; second, Ed Flynn. Ballots were passed out. Collected and counted by Humberto Garcia. Woosleys were the winners.
- B. Ailing members: Pat mentioned that she had recently heard of the following members and former members who are having health issues. She feels membership should know. Linda Monsen hip surgery

Tom and Jean Roche both having issues. Tom is in rehab for several weeks.

Ron and Donna Pavlak are also having health issues

- C. Reminder Chapter Presidents: List of Dates for January Meeting. Chapter Presidents need to prepare a list of dates for activities for the January meeting. We want to avoid having 2 events on the same date.
- D. Anything else? Pat informed members that Chris Schurrer will not be serving as Vice=President next year. He will continue as archivist but feels he cannot serve as Vice-President again. Think about it because someone will have to step up.

4. Standing Committee

- **Membership** Andy Voss said he had sent out renewal forms by email. He has sent out 141 renewal forms, 37 have paid, 29 are lifetime, prepaid, or prize winners. He will send out another reminder. Then he will send out paper copies of the form.
- **Publication** Bob Markert said that last month he sent out a suggestion for Sidelights submissions and got absolutely zero response. This month he is trying again. First is suggesting members send in pictures of their car dressed for the holiday or any vehicle is a holiday setting. Second, he will ask for Christmas cookie recipes.
- Legislative- Lee Nelson said there was nothing on the automotive front but he thought members should know that after 2026 it will be illegal to sell fluorescent light bulbs and after 2027 it will be illegal to own them. They will need to be replaced by LED.

- Rose O'Halloran said she represented the AACA at a meeting of the Landmark Commission in Chicago. They are wanting to tear down part of the historic Auto Row, specifically the 2347 building. Rose spoke of the historic value of the this area of the city. As of November 7, there was no final decision.
- Website- Bill Vroman had nothing new to report.
- Archivist- Len Woelfel reported for Chris Schurrer. Chris has received Silver Springs commemorative plates from Bob Ronning's brother. After being cleaned up, they will be on display at next year's Silver Springs Car Show. He received a ribbon from the 1976 Lake Forest Show from Shirley Davidson. Had a request from a member for old Brighton Run dash plaques. Working on that. Reminder: when chapter's do any tour route, please send a copy to Chris.
- **Car Show Manager**—Jim Sikora reported that the Region Car Show will be on July 20, with set up on July 19. He has spoken to his contact at the village and found out that the contract to have the show went from 3 pages to 9! He is working on it with Humberto Garcia's help.

5. Activities

A.) **Swap Meet**—Bob Markert reported that he did not have good news. Our contact person at Napleton has left and the new person does not seem eager to take on the extra work. There is a lot of set-up and clean up for this contact person. Dale moved to a Honda dealer and we cannot go there as they work on Sundays. Humberto had some suggestions and he and Bob will get together to bounce around a solution.

B.) **Spring Tour**—Dan Sobczyk left his proxy, Dale Woosley, no information about the tour. Pat Markert said she had heard about possibly Grand Rapids or Indiana. Dale said he thought maybe Milwaukee was being considred. Obviously, no decision has been made.

6. Chapter Reports

- Des Plaines Valley-Lee Nelson reported that chapter members atteneded the Brighton Run and the Franklin Old Car Festival in Midlothian.
- Fox Valley-No report
- Silver Springs-Al Matison said they were working on next year's car show and have a holiday party planned for December 14th.
- Waukegan/ North Shore-Dan Helgren reported that the chapter had taken part in the Prewar Tour in September and had visited a car collection in Gurnee. They had 60 cars at the Brighton Run which was fewer than last year. He theorized that the rainy day kept numbers down. He also noted that the chapter holiday party is on December 8 at Parkway on the Lake.

7. Visitor input: None

8. Next Board Meeting—Pat Markert said that the January meeting would be held on 1/11/25 and will be hosted by Region Board. She had no information about the location.

9.. **Adjourn**– Pat asked if there was anything else to discuss. Rick Shaw made a motion to adjourn; second, Jerry Bodden. They adjourned at 10:52 am. Members must have enjoyed the 52 minute meeting as they gave Pat a round of applause.



Jam Thumbprints

2/3 cup butter
1/3 cup sugar
2 egg yolks
1 teaspoon vanilla
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/2 cups flour
2 slightly beaten egg whites
3/4 cup chopped nuts
cherry or strawberry preserves

Cream butter and sugar until fluffy. Add egg yolks, vanilla and salt. Beat well.

Gradually add flour and mix well.

Shape into 3/4-inch balls. Dip in egg whites and roll in nuts.

Place one inch apart on a greased cookie sheet.

Press down centers with your thumb and Bake 350 for 15 to 17 minutes.

Cool slightly and remove from the pan.

Just before serving, fill the centers with preserves.

Italian Plain "Stella Dora Type" Biscotti is Great with Coffee By Barb Hart

Add nuts to dough or after baking you can dip in chocolate 1/2 cup butter 3/4 cups sugar 2 eggs 1 teaspoon rum extract 1 teaspoon anise extract 1 teaspoon baking powder 2 cups flour

Blend all the ingredients together and shape into a loaf 1 inch high by 2 inches wide and about 10 inches long.

Line a cookie sheet with parchment paper or spray with non-stick cooking spray.

Bake 350 degrees F. for 25 min.

Cut into 1-inch slices alternating cookies and re-bake for 7 minutes to toast each slice. Remove the ends if necessary to avoid over-baking.

SUGAR PLUM COOKIES Submitted By Pat Markert

When the kids were little, I really got involved in cookie making at Christmas. Starting in mid-November there would be a flurry of cookie baking. One year I made 17 different kinds of cookies for a total of 184 dozen! This is one of the recipes I used and one of my personal favorites. They are both delicious and inexpensive – a winning combination.

You can freeze these, but don't put on the powdered sugar until you are ready to serve.

¹/₂ cup butter
1 cup sugar
2 slightly beaten eggs
1 ¹/₄ cups chopped dates
¹/₄ cup flour
1 tsp. Vanilla
2 ¹/₂ cups Rice Krispies
1 cup chopped rute (T like percent)



1 cup chopped nuts (I like pecans, but walnuts are good too)

In a saucepan, add first 3 ingredients. Add dates and cook 5 minutes stirring <u>constantly</u>. Add flour and cook 7 minutes until thick. Remove.

Add vanilla, cereal & nuts. Roll into balls about the size of a walnut. Be careful, the mixture is very hot and sticky. Rinse your hands with cool water periodically so the Rice Krispies don't stick to your hands and so that the balls roll smoothly. You have to work fast because you really can't let the date mixture get too cool or it becomes too sticky & thick to roll the balls. It is worth the effort.

Roll balls in powdered sugar before serving.



Caramels Brownies

package German chocolate cake
 2/3 cup canned milk
 1 ¹/₂ sticks butter
 package caramels (approximately 1 pound)
 1 (12-oz) package chocolate chips



Grease a 9 x 13-inch pan. Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Combine cake mix, 1/3 cup canned milk and melted butter. Spread $\frac{1}{2}$ batter in greased pan. Bake 15 minutes (batter will be firm but not fully baked). Combine caramels and 1/3 cup canned milk, melt in a microwave; spread over warm cake. Sprinkle with chocolate chips. Cover with remaining cake mix. Bake for 25 minutes. Note: batter is so thick, just drop "blobs" on top – it will spread while baking. Cut when cool.

Peanut Butter Cookies

Mom Maurer's Recipe

1/2 Cup Shortening
1/2 Cup Peanut Butter
1/2 Cup Brown Sugar
1/2 Cup Granulated Sugar
1/2 Tsp. Vanilla
1 Egg
1 1/2 Cups Flour
1 Tsp. Soda
1 Tsp. Salt



Cream Shortening- Combine with peanut butter and continue creaming until soft & well blended- Add the brown sugar, the granulated sugar and the vanilla- Continue creaming until fluffy- Beat the egg slightly, add it to the creamed mixture and beat well- Sift the flower, soda & salt together- Blend the dry ingredients into the mixture- Shape dough into small balls and place them on an un-greased cookie sheet. Dip the tines of a fork into sugar and flatten the cookie balls.- Bake in oven at 375 o for 10 to 12 minutes.- Makes 4 to 5 dozen cookies.



Snickdoodle Cookies

1 cup soft butter	}	
1-1/2 cup sugar	}	mix together
2 eggs	}	
2-3/4 cup flour	}	
2 tsp cream of tartar	}	sift together
1 tsp soda	}	
1/2 tsp salt	}	

Jenny Risley (Grandmother's original recipe)



Combine wet & dry ingredients. Chill dough. Roll dough into ball size of a small walnut. Roll ball in mixture of 3 Tbl sugar and 1/4 tsp nutmeg. Place 2" apart on ungreased cookie sheet. Bake until lightly browned, but still soft at 350 degrees for 8-10 minutes. These cookies puff up first then flatten out. Let cool briefly on cookie sheet before removing. Yields about 6 dozen cookies depending on size of the ball.

NOTE: These cookies are different from Snick<u>er</u>doodles due to Nutmeg being used in sugar mixture instead of Cinnamon.

PECANETTES

This was a favorite recipe of my Mom's. She always made them for Christmas. One year, my friend Candy, Mom and I had a Christmas craft sale. The night before it, we had a huge snowstorm with over 3" of snow. Needless to say, there were not a lot of people who came to the sale. Mom put out a sample plate of her cookies. Yup, everyone who came left with a plate of her cookies!

- $\frac{3}{4}$ c. sifted powdered sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. butter
- $1\frac{1}{2}$ c sifted flour
- 2 tsp. vanilla
- 1 c. finely chopped pecans

Mix all ingredients and put in refrigerator for 1 hour or overnight. Shape into balls or crescents. Bake at 325° for 25 minutes or until light brown.

When ready to serve, cover with powdered sugar.

I've also included the photos that it was created from.




