We started by meeting at Sugar Bowl restaurant, located in Des Plaines for a hardy breakfast served with cheerful conversations. We drove through Morton Grove, looking at the quaint homes, on our way to visit the Morton Grove Historical Society. Haupt-Yehl house was built in 1888 when the area was still farmland outside the Chicago area. Saving this wonderful home, required it be me moved off its foundation to three different areas and now is located on the Park District's property, run by the Morton Grove Historical Society. The inside is furnished in original appliances, furniture, and artifacts to the time era it was built.



The basement has more historical artifacts from the time-period, to explore. You are allowed to play with a train set. Our time passed quickly and there was still so much to see. Several members are planning to return on their own. Morton Grove Historical Society wanted a group picture of us.



Off to our next stop, Double Clutch Brewery located in the suburb of Evanston where the manager had reserved parking for the AACA members. This was great we could park our cars together. Several bar patrons came out to look at our cars.





We were to have a tour of their car collection and learn about the brewery operations but due to some unfortunate time it was cancelled. We still enjoyed the cars on display at the brewery, and had a good lunch. We are at a brewery surrounded by unique, antique cars, of course we will make our own fun.









After our lunch, a scenic neighborhood ride back to Morton Grove, to our final stop, The Shrine of all Saints at St. Martha of Bethany Church. This is the 3rd largest reliquary repository in the world, with over 5,000 different relics representing 3,200 catholic saints. I was impressed that the 3rd largest located here, the 2nd is in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvainia, both are in the USA. The largest reliquary repository is the Vatican in Rome.









We learned how the relics are classed. Then broke out into three groups with a guide giving us a tour around the shrine. The Shrine of All Saints is housed in a gym that was converted into a church. St Martha of Bethany became too small to hold all its parishioners, moved over to the gym with the relics. Masses are still held in this facility. This was a moving experience for me. There was so much to see. I could not see it all in one visit.

ILLINOIS REGION A. A. C. A. FALL TOUR OCTOBER 16-19, 2025

The place to be in Mid-October is Urbana, Illinois, and we cordially invite you to join in on the fun! We can't wait to see everyone! The tour headquarters will be located at the Comfort Suites on the north side of Urbana, Illinois and we will travel within the vicinity spending notable time in both the communities of Monticello and Paxton, Illinois as well.

Activities will commence on Thursday with a group caravan departing at 10:00 A.M. from the Jewel-Osco in Woodstock, Illinois (145 S. Eastwood Dr.), and will travel down ILL Rt. 47 with pickup points at Jewel-Osco in Elburn, ILL at 10:45 A.M. (800 N. Main St.), Menard's in Yorkville, ILL at 11:15 A.M. (1800 Marketview Dr.) with a final pickup point and a stop for lunch at Sherwood Oaks in Morris, ILL at 12:00 Noon (1571 N. Division St.), voted the best family restaurant in Greater Grundy County. Form there we will travel through Dwight (touching a bit of U. S. Rt. 66), Gibson City, and Rantoul before stopping at the Champaign County Historical Museum at the historic Cattle Bank. Registration will be open at 6 P.M. in the hospitality room.

Friday sets off at 8:30 A.M. on an 100-mile tour through the beautiful countryside. First thought, a stone's throw away will be a visit to the Alan Strong collection to see some absolutely exquisite vehicles through many of the earlier eras of automobiles. From there we will travel to the Museum of the Grand Prairie, a museum about the pioneers to the area, complete with a travel through a covered bridge. From there it's on to the Monticello Railway Museum, who are opening especially for us so we can see all their locomotives and rolling stock. From there it's to the artsy downtown of Monticello to explore the shops and restaurants. Our visit to Allerton Park will be the cap of the evening, with its expansive grounds; forty-room house; and famous outdoor statuary. We will get a historical overview of the grounds, and then participants can explore the vast space at their leisure. Additionally, they will be hosting their Weekend Wind-Down event, which we have been invited to. Enjoy visiting the mansion where beverages can be had to refresh, with a folk / rock & roll duo performing on the grounds, and even lawn games, weather permitting. The hospitality room will be open at the hotel as well.

Saturday sets off at 8:30 A.M. as well, but on a 70-mile jaunt northward to Paxton to first view the large Royce Baier car collection. In the first building, with a nice old downtown décor at the same time, milliner Pat Milchuck will display and demonstrate some of the styles of her creations which are known around the world, immediately after the exploration of vintage automobiles, we will be able to tour the absolutely beautiful Queen Anne style 1891 Middlecoff Mansion. Afterward we will explore downtown Paxton for lunch. Then it's a short walk to the historic Ford County Sheriff's Home and Jail where we will have a tour of this home. Afterward, it's time to truly explore the revived downtown Paxton is so proud of. There are many interesting shops, so make sure to check them all out. But wait, there's more! At 3:00 P.M., the Silver Tree Distillery, located in a former car dealership owned by members of a multi-generational farming family in the area will open especially for us.

The feeling of being one of the locals will culminate with our wonderful and unique banquet. We will travel to the Mount Vernon Methodist Church in rural Champaign (the second-oldest church building in the county) for a down-home barbecue dinner from award winning Hickory River Smokehouse. After dinner, head upstairs to the church sanctuary to view the interior of the church, and for our banquet presentation of Hensley Township (which the church is located), and the church itself. What a finale to this year's tour!

But wait, there's more! Sunday we will depart at the leisurely 9:00 A.M. and depart the area heading for home, with a stop at the Lynn Frantz collection in Cullom, ILL where one can explore a long-standing large collection of all things vintage automobile and vintage tractor. From there's it's a hop, skip, and a jump to either I – 55 or I – 57 and off toward home.

The headquarters, Comfort Suites, 2001 N. Lincoln Avenue, Urbana, ILL 61801, is located at the intersection of I-74 and Lincoln Avenue, between I-57 and U. S. Rt. 45. There is ample grass parking for trailers on property or asphalt parking for trailers can be arranged behind the hotel to the north of the headquarters.

And if one is still looking for more, there are additional optional activities which will be mentioned at a later time to help fill the day even more, if that is even possible.

With all the above and more, this won't be a tour to miss. So, make sure to fill out the next page and register today! We can't wait to see you there. We have taken the original DesPlaines Valley Fall Tour, and are revisiting the tour as much as possible, while making it our own for today as well, presenting the best of both worlds!

Pat will be on site ready to showcase her masterpieces of cloth. And that's still not all! Inside the building is an ice cream parlor. Any time is a good time for ice cream!





And that was on the edge! Just a quick drive is downtown proper. A stroll down Market Street will have everyone find something they fancy. Gift stores like the Paxton Mercantile full of fun gifts, with many being made locally, Ruby Jewel Antiques for all those treasurers from times gone by, and Hudson's Drugstore. That quintessential drug store of old, with a large collection of Hallmark products. They are celebrating their 75th Anniversary this year.

EXPLORE & RELAX AT ALLERTON PARK

To cap our Friday, we will visit the vast 1,500 acre Allerton Park, the former home of Robert Allerton, the son of a founder of the Chicago Union Stockyards and First National Bank of Chicago. Robert envisioned the property becoming a gentleman's estate on the land formerly used for farming and grazing pastures. The mansion was bought in 1900 inspired by the Ham House, home of the Earl of Dysart near London, England. It was at this time that Robert began collecting ideas and sculptures from abroad until 1946 when Robert donated the property to the University of Illinois. Apart from the mansion, whose 1st floor can be visited, the grounds are home to over 100 sculptures and ornaments with 14 formal gardens on its sprawling 1,500 acres. Nature lovers will find 31 tree, over 1,000 flowering plant, and 154 different bird and mammal species making their home here. A not to miss sight is the 1,600 lb. Sun Singer statue by Carl Milles rising 30 feet from the ground. The view is at any time fantastic, but if timed right for sunset, which we will have the opportunity to witness. The sun seeming to be held in the statues outstretched hands is purely awe inspiring.



But even while the sun sets, there are many things to do at Allerton Park. We have been invited by the park to join them in their Weekend Wind Down. Starting at 5p sit back, take a sip, and relax in the mansion's solarium overlooking the Koi Pond, where yard games can be played if weather permits. 
