

1. Welcome—Dan Sobczyk called the meeting to order at 10:53 am. He welcomed the board members and the visitors.

Roll Call: Present: Dan Sobczyk, Chris Schurrer, Pat Markert, Bob Wenderski, JoAnn Flynn, Ed Flynn, Bill Vroman, Rose O' Halloran, Nancy Nelson, Bibiana Garcia, Jerry Bodden, Lee Nelson, Al Matison, Andy Voss, Bob Markert. Dan Helgren absent/ proxy is Chris Schurrer. Jim Sikora absent/ proxy is Bob Markert. Visitors: Joanna Vroman, Cheryl and Dale Woosley, Joan Bodden and Humberto Garcia.

Secretary Report: Pat Markert reported that she had sent the minutes of the November meeting out shortly after the meeting and again last week asking for additions, corrections and deletions. There were none. Al Matison made a motion to accept the Secretary's report as written; second Bill Vroman. Passed.

She also reported that one of the members, Ken Muellner, was ill and currently in a nursing home recuperated. Ken found that he was suffering from cancer of the blood. This type of cancer thickens the blood. If not diagnosed, the patient would suffer from a stroke. Ken is getting medication to thin the blood, but as a consequence of the disease, he had to have the toes on his right foot amputated. As of February 3, he is at Astoria Place, 6300 N. California Ave., Chicago 60659.

Treasurer report- Bob Wenderski reported that as of February 3, 2024, the Region has increased revenues primarily from membership renewals. The Region paid out money for meeting refreshments, Sidelights publication, stamps and chapter dues reimbursements. Paid or comp memberships total 93. Chris Schurrer made a motion to approve the report: second, Bill Vroman. Passed

#### Standing Committees:

Membership — Andy Voss reported that he would have the final roster list ready to send to National in just a couple of days. He handed out a list of members who have still not paid their dues and asked board members to contact any that they knew.

**Publication**— Bob Markert remarked that Laura enjoys doing the Sidelights,, but asked that if you send in a flyer or an event, please be sure to give time and dates as she gets inquiries and doesn't have the information. It was suggested that she attach to incomplete notices that tells members who to contact i.e. the chapter President.

**Legislative**- Lee Nelson reported that there were a lot of law changes at the beginning of the year. For example:

- 1. If you build or remodel a home, you must include a spot for an electric vehicle
- 2. If you buy a car online, you can now sign the papers when the car is delivered
- 3. The Department of Transportation must develop an app that will give real time traffic and weather information.
- 4. If you chose to put decorative lights on a motorcycle, you may not use blue.
- 5. You may have a video conference while driving.

- 6. You may no longer be pulled over for having something hanging on your rear view mirror. If the police pull you over some other infraction, they can still give you a ticket for having obstructive vision, but they may not pull you over just for that.
- 7. Tollway transponders, as they expire, are being replaced by stickers which should be mounted on the windshield just behind the rear view mirror.

Lee said there are more, but these are some of the more interesting.

**Website**- Bill Vroman reported that the website is doing well and is up to date. He adds new dates as soon as he receives them.

Archivist- Chris Schurrer reported that their search for the 1975 tour to Galena has produced results but they are still looking for copies of the old tour. He also mentioned that someone has donated a large pile of Antique Automobile magazines. Our Region does not archive these. So, in the near future Chris will be looking for someone to take some of these magazines to donate them to National.

#### 3. Activities

- A.) Swap Meet 2024—Bob Markert reported that he has just recently received a go ahead from Napleton Chevrolet. Dale Baum, who is our liaison at Napleton, recently lost his wife, but is going ahead with plans for the Swap Meet. Date of the **Swap Meet is Sunday**, **April 7**. Bob also mentioned that we need help to run the meet. He sent sheets around the meeting for people to sign up to help. Bob Wenderski volunteered to print the flyers.
- B) Spring Tour WA-NS hosts. Chris Schurrer reported that the tour is moving earlier in the month of May. The plan is for the tour to be May 2-5 headquartering at the Chestnut Mountain Resort in the Galena area. Chris reported that the banquet will be held at the hotel and that there will probably be a tour heading home.
- C) Fall Tour The SS chapter is planning on moving the Fall Tour into September. They are considering a tour to Greenfield Village outside of Detroit. We will be staying at a Best Western Hotel that has a shuttle to Greenfield. There would be little touring on this trip. Basically you drive to the hotel and leave the car there for the whole stay. The Old Car Festival will be going on while we are there and is the impetus for us going. Dates for the tour would be September 4-8.

#### .4. Chapter Reports

- Des Plaines Valley-Lee Nelson reported that the Chapter had hosted the Fall Tour followed quickly by the November Board Meeting. They are now in hibernation for the winter.
- Fox Valley-Dan Sobczyk said that the FV chapter is planning an outing to the Elgin Historical Museum on March 23 and a Pizza party and Model Car Show for a date in April. He said they were also for a place to hold the Potluck and Auction event.
- Silver Springs-Al Matison said that the SS chapter is having a lunch and bowling party on February 24 in Plano. They already working on the May Flea Market and Car Show.
- Waukegan/ North Shore-Dan Helgren reported that the chapter had their Christmas party at Parkway on the Lake in Ingleside again last December. They elected the same officers for 2024 but because Don Schreiber has some health problems, he is being replaced by Paul Maurer. They are planning a St. Pat's party on March 24 and are working on the Spring Tour.

#### 5. Old Business:

Pat Markert brought up that a member had asked about getting AACA jackets as his old one is getting worn out. Humberto Garcia offered to look into pricing, sizing and design.

Al Matison mentioned that chapter member Terri Shaw's son had to have his leg amputated. She and Rick are currently out east helping out during this time. He also mentioned that former member John Baxter's son passed away suddenly and He and Carla are in attending to this.

#### 6. New Business:

- Board candidates: Pat Markert as the ballot committee reported that they sent out 247 ballots and received 72 back. Elected were Dale Woosley, Rick Shaw and Chris Schurrer. Dan Sobczyk asked how many are normally returned and were any write in candidates given. Pat answered that normally they receive about 175 back and that no write in candidates were given.
- •Lichtfeld Award: The Lichtfeld Award, normally given at this meeting, would not be presented as Jenny Risley could not make this meeting. The plan is to present it at the March meeting.
  - 7. Visitor input Humberto Garcia came up with several ideas for promoting the club and, hopefully, attract new members. Among the items mentioned were windows decals and magnetic signs. He felt that using these during local activities would let people know that we are a club and have activities thus engendering more interest in joining. Jo Ann Flynn made a motion for the board to get more information about the cost of getting these things. Rose O'Halloran second. Passed.

Humberto said he would get together this information. Other possible ideas to increase interest suggested by Humberto were monthly meetings, having a brunch and taking part in parades of various towns.

Jerry Bodden mentioned the antique car dealer called Gateway to Kenosha has an open house the last Saturday of each month. If a car club shows up with 20 cars, the dealer pays the club \$200. Jerry related that one of the clubs to which he belongs has done this several time. Occasionally when they had less than 20 cars, the dealer still paid them \$20 per car for those that did show up. This might be a good way to advertise the club and attract new members as there are a lot of lookers. The commitment is to be at the dealership from 9 am to noon. And they have donuts and coffee!

Dan thanked board members Bill Vroman and Jo Ann Flynn who are ending their terms on the board for all their hard work and attendance at board meetings.

A motion was made by Jo Ann Flynn to adjourn the meeting; second, Bob Markert. Passed. Meeting adjourned at 12:03 pm.

## Monthly Recipe

#### Shamrock Shake Pie

#### Ingredients

12 graham crackers

- 2 tablespoon brown sugar
- $\frac{1}{2}$  cup butter, melted
- $2\frac{1}{2}$  cups milk, cold
- ½ teaspoon green food coloring
- 2 teaspoons mint extract
- 5.1 ounce box of instant vanilla pudding mix 8 ounces container whipped topping, thawed



#### Instructions

Grease a 9-inch pie dish with butter or shortening and set it aside.

Place the graham crackers and brown sugar in a food processor and blend until the graham crackers become fine crumbs. While the food processor runs at low speed, gradually pour in the melted butter until the crumbs start to stick together.

Firmly press the crumbs into the bottom and up the sides of the pie dish, and place it in the freezer for 15-20 minutes, or until the crust is firm.

While the crust is freezing, whisk the milk, green food coloring, and mint extract in a large bowl until the food coloring is distributed evenly and the milk is green.

Add the vanilla pudding mix and continue whisking until the pudding starts to thicken. Let the pudding rest for about 5 minutes to thicken up more.

Fold the whipped topping into the pudding until it is well mixed, then spoon the pie filling into the crust, and smooth out the top of the pie.

Place the pie in the freezer for at least 6 hours or until the filling is completely set. Top with whipped cream and maraschino cherries, if desired, and serve cold.






